7 Steps to Effectively Set Up and Maintain Temporary Fencing

Step 1: Evaluate Site

Begin by assessing the site's suitability for installing temporary fence. Ensure the ground is level and free from obstacles. Consider potential weather conditions, as strong winds and rain can impact the installation process and the stability of the fence. Ensure that the fence can be placed such that the fence and any stays avoid obstructing workers and pedestrians. Once the site is ready, proceed to assemble the fence.

Step 2: Procure Necessary Tools & Materials

After evaluating the site, gather essential tools and materials for the installation. This includes a shifting spanner, brackets, clamps, fence bases, stays, nuts, bolts, fence panels, and any additional equipment required for the process.

Step 3: Panel Placement

With the site prepared and tools at hand, start the installation by placing a temporary fence base in the desired location. Insert one end of a fence panel into the base's hole, positioning another base for the opposite panel end. This will secure the panel in place.

Step 4: Attach Interconnecting Panels

Attach the next panel by inserting its leg into the base and adding another base at its end. Ensure proper connection using temporary fencing clamps secured with nuts and bolts. Tighten the bolts adequately for stability, while keeping the thread side facing inwards for safety. Repeat until the intended area is enclosed.

Step 5: Stabilising with Stays

Stays may be required for maintaining the fences stability. After erecting the panels, attach stays to the back using brackets. Place brackets at the bottom and middle of the vertical strut and weigh the stays down with fence bases for added stability.

Step 6: Enhancing Security and Privacy

Consider enhancing security and privacy by wrapping the fence. Many local councils require this to prevent debris from affecting public spaces. Use banner mesh or shade cloth rolls for this purpose. Banner mesh can also serve as cost-effective advertising mediums. Where the fence is wrapped, brace stays and counter weights WILL be required to prevent the fence from blowing over.

Step 7: Ongoing Maintenance

Regularly inspect your fence for maintenance. Check the position of the base, the position of stays, the tightness of clamps, and the correct positioning of bases on any stays. Ensuring these elements are in good condition will help maintain the effectiveness of the fence over time.
